



- How many plants do I use in my planter?
 - Based on using a 4" pot size
 - 3 to 4 plants in 12-inch planter
 - 4 to 6 plants in 16-inch planter
 - 6 to 8 plants in 20-inch planter

• The size of the plants when purchased will help determine how many per pot





Additional considerations when deciding how many plants to use in your planter:

- Adjust the number of plants by considering the vigor and final size of the plants
- Fast growers will require less plants per pot
- Dwarf and compact growers can be placed closer together







How much soil do I need?

- 12 inch pot = 0.77 cu. ft.
- 14 inch pot = 1 cu. ft.
- 16 inch pot = 1.5 cu. ft.
- 18 inch pot = 2.3 cu. ft.
- 24 inch pot = 3.8 cu. ft.
- 30 inch pot = 4.6 cu. ft.

25 dry quarts = 1 cu. ft.

Allow for soil compaction







Fertilizing your Containers

- If slow release or organic fertilizer was mixed in the soil when first planted, may not need additional nutrients for 2-3 months
- Depending on plant types, liquid fertilizers such as Fish Emulsion or Miracle Gro can be added monthly
- When adding fertilizers make sure plants have been well watered a day or two before
